

Letter of Condition for Lower Lake Group Camp, Peter Lougheed Prov. Park

Access to Group Camp and Directions

- The group camp is gated and locked. The **gate combination** is *1414*. It recommended that you keep the gate closed and locked. It is the responsibility of the account holder to notify other members of their group of the combination. We cannot give out combination to anyone other than the account holder, or unlock the gate for them. Please note that there is a \$30 charge for lost or damaged locks.
- Directions: From Calgary, head west on Highway 1. Exit at Highway 40 (Kananaskis Trail). Travel south 50 km and then turn right onto Kananaskis Lakes Trail. Follow this road for 10 km. Turn right at entrance to Lower Lake Day Use Area/Group Camp. Entrance to group camp is partway down the road, on the right.

Discounts and Additional Charges

- Nightly rate includes the first 10 accommodation units on site. Additional units are \$23 per unit per night. Extra unit fees will be counted and collected on site and are payable by cash, Visa or MasterCard. If using a credit card, it must be presented on-site.
- Discounts are offered to senior and youth non-profit groups on Sunday-Thursday night stays.
- Each nightly fee includes a bin of firewood (approximately 1/5 of a cord). Additional wood can be purchased at a charge of \$45 per bin.

Rules and Regulations

- Check-in time is 4pm. Check-out time is 2pm.
- Account holders are responsible for the actions of all camping party members and any visitors to their group camping area.
- Quiet time is in effect from 11pm to 7am. Loud partying, stereos at high volume and rowdy behaviour are not tolerated at any time. Use of fireworks is prohibited.
- Campfires are permitted only in the facilities provided. Never leave campfires unattended. Collection and burning of deadfall is prohibited.
- Pets must be kept on leash at all times.
- Bears do frequent the area so the group camp must be kept clean. Garbage should be placed in bear proof containers. All food and hard-sided coolers must be kept in a vehicle, hard-sided accommodation unit, or locked in group camp shelter building.
- All units must remain on designated camping pads or in parking areas.
- Groups larger than 65 people and special events require a permit from Alberta Parks. Contact permit co-ordinator at 403-851-2207.

Please Note

- In the winter and shoulder seasons the water system is shut down and it is recommended that users bring their own water.
- To **change** or **cancel** your winter reservation (November 1st through March 31st) please call us at 403-591-7226 and choose option 3 for group camp inquiries. **10 days' notice** of cancellation is required to receive a refund of camping fees. Please note that the reservation fee (\$12) is non-refundable.
